 The U.S. revamps its foreign assistance and makes development equal to diplomacy and defense. Skip ahead three spaces.



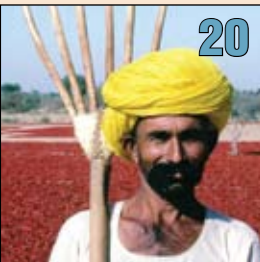
